Ray Appenheimer: Head Coach of the Men's and Women's Track and Field and Cross Country Teams, Oberlin College:

Appenheimer has had an enormously successful career of coaching at Oberlin. His athletes have achieved impressive finishes in competition and have also won honors as having some of the highest grade-point averages in the nation. Appenheimer graduated from Colgate University, magna cum laude, with a degree in English and was a Rhodes Scholar Finalist. As an athlete, he was a five-time All American and a member of the Nike Farm Team. He was a member of the United States Cross Country Team and has won national titles in cross country and in track.

Christa Champion: Head Women's Basketball Coach, Oberlin College

Champion has impressive experience as a coach and as an athlete. A standout basketball player for Brown University, she was selected three times to the All-Ivy League Team. She was a three-time Academic All American and a recipient of an NCAA post-graduate scholarship. After college she played semi-professional basketball and was a member of the United States National Handball Team. She earned her graduate degree from Smith College in exercise and sports studies.

Sally Stunkel: Visiting Professor of Opera at Oberlin Conservatory.

Stunkel has directed over 90 opera productions nationwide, including productions for the Sacramento Opera, Tulsa Opera, Des Moines Opera, and the Aspen Music Festival. She has headed opera programs for the University of the Pacific and the University of Iowa, among others. As a performer, she has sung for the Colorado Springs Opera, the Skylight Opera, and the Baltimore Opera. In addition to her operatic training, her background includes 15 years of dance training.

Paul Treuhaft MD: Cleveland Clinic Foundation, Lorain Orthopedics Group, Deputy Coroner, Lorain County

A 1964 graduate of Oberlin College, Treuhaft obtained his medical degree from the University of Chicago School of Medicine in 1968. He also received a master's degree from Case Western University in bioethics in 2000. For many years, his practice was of a general orthopedic focus, with an emphasis on joint replacement, revision joint replacement, and sports medicine. He is currently focused primarily on non-operative orthopedic care.

Matthew Wright: Associate Professor of Theatre at Oberlin College

Wright is an actor, director, and theatre educator. As an actor, he has appeared in many nationally acclaimed regional theatres. As an educator, he has served on the faculties of

The Ohio State University, Wright State University, and has headed the graduate acting training program at Florida Atlantic University for 10 years. He continues to perform professionally.
