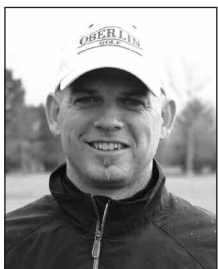


Blake New—Head Coach



Blake New begins his fifth season as the head coach for the men's golf team. He brings a professional knowledge of the game to Oberlin, and he has spent time each of the past eight years teaching golf both to newcomers and seasoned players.

New began his career at the Family Golf Center in Brecksville, Ohio, where he worked for two years teaching 30 lessons per week. He then became the first assistant professional at the Oberlin Country Club, serving in that capacity until 1996. He helped revive the men's varsity program in 2002.

"The philosophy of the golf program is to teach the fundamentals required for our player to self-correct and improve on their own," New says. "While golf is inherently an individual sport, we also spend time teaching the importance of teamwork and accountability."

New, who also heads the men's soccer program, is a 1991 graduate of Cleveland State University. He earned his master's degree in sports management from CSU in 1992. New resides in Oberlin with his wife Jessa and their daughter Madeline.

2006 Outlook

The men's golf squad saw some high points in 2005, duplicating an eighth-place finish at the NCAC Championships and shooting a draw with Hiram College in early April. Despite graduating its top scorer Tom King, the Yeomen feel confident that another year of experience will help move the rest of the squad up the conference ladder.

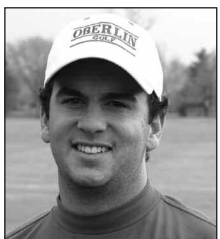
