Anyone who likes the library should join! It's free, and once you join you'll get regular news updates about the library as well as invitations to super cool events.

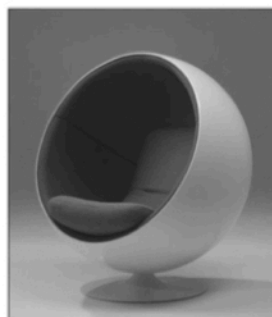

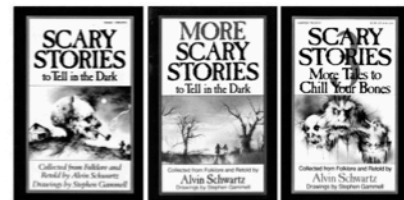
