When the Dean of Studies begins the process of assigning academic advisors, she will use the information on this form to make appropriate assignments. This information, along with information you provided during the admissions process, will also help your advisor know more about you before your meeting during Orientation.

Your academic advisor may be the instructor of your first-year seminar, a faculty member in the department of your intended major or in a general area of interest to you, or a member of Oberlin's professional staff. Normally, faculty members in the Conservatory of Music do not advise incoming arts and sciences students. If your academic interest is in music, you may be assigned to an arts and

sciences faculty member who has expertise in advising students interested in music. Advisor assignments are made over the summer; students learn who their advisors are and meet them for the first time during Orientation.

Your advisor will help you plan your course schedule, discuss more broadly a liberal arts education, and help you think about options during your college experience.

Double-degree students will have both an arts and sciences advisor and a conservatory advisor. This form is only for the advisor in the College of Arts and Sciences. The Conservatory assigns advisors according to a student's major or studio teacher.
