Frank Church – River of No Return Wilderness (twice the size of Delaware) (established as RNR on 23 July 1980; legislation sponsored by Senator Frank Church; renamed 14 March 1984; Frank Church dies 7 April 1984)

Selway-Bitteroot Wilderness

(larger than Delaware) (established through the original Wilderness Act on 3 September 1964; sponsored by Senator Frank Church)

Great Burn Wilderness [proposed] includes Kelly Creek





FRANK FORRESTER CHURCH 1924 – 1984

Frank Charch loved the splendor and beauty of Idaho's great outdoor and devoted his life to its preservation.

Through a career that spanned 24 years in the U.S. Senate, 1956 - 1980, Frank Church helped write the major legislation of his era to protect the nation's untrammeled wilderness and the majesty of its free-flowing rivers.

Among other accomplishments, his vision was incorporated in these laws:

In 1984, Congress honored the memory of Frank Church by renaming this area the Frank Church - River of No Return Wilderness.


