

# **Class Connectors**

## **Volunteer Role Description**

### **Overview:**

Class connectors are key Oberlin advocates, helping to keep the Oberlin spirit alive by fostering connections between classmates, clusters, and the College. Through fun and meaningful engagement, they strengthen the Oberlin community for today's students and future generations.

Each cluster may have up to 3 class connectors. Terms last for two years and are renewable.

### **Responsibilities:**

As a class connector, you'll help keep Obies within your cluster informed, engaged, and excited about Oberlin. Here's how you'll make an impact:

- **Join a virtual training** – Participate in an online session each September where you will receive the information you need to carry out your duties and hear from campus leaders about important happenings on campus. (Recordings available if you miss it.)
- **Stay informed**– Keep up with Oberlin news through publications, social media, emails, and newsletters.
- **Keep in touch** – Send classmates an end of year or new year message celebrating alumni, sharing Oberlin updates, and fostering class spirit. Messages can be video-based or a traditional email "letter" with or without photos. Help the Office of Alumni Engagement share out other news and build excitement for events periodically when requested.
- **Encourage class philanthropy**– Support efforts such as the annual fund and any applicable class funds that benefit students.
- **Collaborate with the Office of Alumni Engagement** – Occasionally provide insights, recommend venues, or connect with students interested in your career field.
- **Support your class reunion** – If your term coincides with a reunion year, you're encouraged (but not required) to serve on the reunion planning committee. Even if you don't join the committee, you'll play a key role in encouraging classmates and clustermates to attend and engage in reunion activities.

- **Invite additional Engagement (optional)** – Encourage additional engagement among members of your cluster by inviting them to join you in participating in a virtual or regional event hosted by Oberlin, plan your own virtual gathering, or get creative with interactive projects like a shared recipe board, reading list, or photo gallery. The Office of Alumni Engagement is here to support you with these efforts!

## **Location:**

Remote

## **Time commitment:**

This role requires about 10-15 hours per year, making it a flexible way to stay engaged with your class and cluster. Class connectors serve for two years, with the option to continue for additional terms

## **Who should volunteer for this role?**

Alumni from the class of 2002 to present who are enthusiastic about keeping classmates connected in positive ways and ensuring Oberlin remains strong into the future.
