Class Officers

Volunteer Role Description

Overview:

Class Officers are key Oberlin advocates, helping to keep classmates connected and engaged while strengthening Oberlin for future generations. Each class may have up to two class officers per term with the following possible configurations:

- One solo Class President
- One Class President and one Vice President
- Two Co-Presidents

Responsibilities:

As a Class Officers, you'll be a key representative for your class, fostering connections, sharing updates, and encouraging alumni involvement. Here's how you'll make an impact:

- **Join a virtual training** Participate in an online session each September where you will receive the information you need to carry out your duties and hear from campus leaders about important happenings on campus. (Recordings available if you miss it.)
- Stay informed

 Keep up with Oberlin news through publications, social media, emails, and newsletters.
- **Keep in touch** Send at least two class messages per year celebrating alumni, sharing Oberlin updates, and fostering class spirit. Messages can be written, video-based, or include photos.
- **Support your class reunion** Serve on your class's reunion planning committee to help organize and promote reunion activities.
- Encourage class philanthropy— Support efforts such as the annual fund and any applicable class funds that benefit students.
- Collaborate with the Office of Alumni Engagement Occasionally provide insights, recommend venues, or connect with students interested in your career field.

Optional Activities:

Class Officers may also choose to:

Host a class engagement activity – Plan a class gathering or activity during non-reunion years.
 Keep it simple, like a virtual discussion around an Oberlin event, or get creative with interactive projects like a shared recipe board or trivia night!

Time commitment:

Approximately 10-15 hours per year. Class Officers commit to a 5-year term and may choose to serve multiple terms at the discretion of the Office of Alumni Engagement.
